On June 12, 2015, this matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) for hearing as a contested case pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 to-15 and N.J.S.A. 52:14F 1 to-13. A Public Hearing was held on September 29, 2015 in Hardyston, New

Jersey. During the pendency of the case at the OAL, the parties reached a Settlement. A Settlement Agreement was prepared and executed indicating the terms of the agreement, which are incorporated herein by reference.

I have reviewed the record and the terms of settlement and I FIND:

- 1. The parties have voluntarily agreed to the settlement as evidenced by their agreement or their representatives' agreement as set forth above.
- 2. The settlement fully disposes of all issues in controversy and is consistent with the law.

I CONCLUDE that this agreement meets the requirements of N.J.A.C. 1:1-19.1 and that the settlement should be approved. I approve the settlement and therefore ORDER that the parties comply with the settlement terms and that these proceedings be concluded.

I hereby FILE my initial decision with the BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES for consideration.

This recommended decision may be adopted, modified or rejected by the **BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES**, which by law is authorized to make a final decision in this matter. If the Board of Public Utilities does not adopt, modify or reject this decision within forty-five days and unless such time limit is otherwise extended, this recommended decision shall become a final decision in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-10.

TO THE HONORABLE NEW JERSEY BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

The Parties that have participated in this proceeding are as follows: the Wallkill Sewer Division of Aqua New Jersey, Inc. ("Aqua," "Company," or "Petitioner"), the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel") and the Staff of the Board of Public Utilities ("Staff") (collectively, the "Parties"). There were no intervenors in this proceeding. As a result of an analysis of Aqua's Petition and exhibits, discovery conducted by Rate Counsel and the Staff, conferences, and negotiations, the Parties to this proceeding have come to the within agreement. The Parties hereto agree and stipulate as follows:

- 1. Petitioner, the Wallkill Sewer Division of Aqua New Jersey, Inc., operates a sewage collection and transmission system within a portion of the Township of Hardyston, County of Sussex, New Jersey. Petitioner serves approximately 399 customers within this portion of its service territory. Aqua New Jersey, Inc. is a public utility corporation of the State of New Jersey subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Public Utilities (the "Board"). Aqua's principal business office is located at 10 Black Forest Road, Hamilton, New Jersey 08691.
- 2. On May 26, 2015, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq., Aqua filed the above-captioned Petition with the Board, which was later assigned Docket No. WR15050631, for approval of a comprehensive reconciliation of purchased wastewater treatment adjustment clause ("PSTAC") costs and revenues for calendar years 2007 to 2013, to recover the actual under-recovery experienced in 2014, and to set prospective rates for calendar year 2016 (as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7) totaling \$212,259, an increase of \$74,809. Aqua will true-up 2015 PSTAC revenues and rates in its 2016 PSTAC filing, and commits that it will make this filing no later than June 30, 2016.
- 3. A public comment hearing was conducted on the evening of September 29, 2015 in the service territory. Four members of the public attended the hearing, but indicated they were not customers of the Company and did not wish to make a statement regarding the Company's request.
- 4. Petitioner's rates reflect the recovery of wastewater treatment charges imposed by the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority ("SCUMA"). The current PSTAC tariff was last examined and approved by the Board in an Order in Docket No. WR07040245, dated October 8, 2009, which examined PSTAC revenues and expenses applicable to the period ending December 31, 2006. In that Order, the Board also directed Wallkill to file PSTAC true-up

schedules for 2007 and 2008 within sixty days. At the time of the Board's Order in 2009, the Wallkill Sewer Company was independently owned and operated by Edgewater Associates. Wallkill did not make the true-up filings required by the Board, and was eventually acquired by Aqua in late 2010. Due to the unique facts of this case and the adverse impact of increased litigation filing costs upon ratepayers, Aqua seeks a limited waiver, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:1-1.2(b), of the requirements to file annual PSTAC true-ups and annual petitions for adjustment pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.3(e), from 2010 to 2013.

- 5. In this proceeding, the Parties have examined Wallkill's actual revenues and actual SCUMA expenses for the calendar years 2007 through 2013. During that period, Wallkill's wastewater treatment expenses exceeded revenues by \$52,150, resulting in an underrecovery of that amount. Aqua agrees that it will not seek to recover this amount from customers.
- 6. In this proceeding, the Parties have also examined the Company's actual revenues and actual SCUMA expenses for calendar year 2014, and the Company's projected OCUA expenses for 2016, as well as the costs of this proceeding. Based on the foregoing, the Parties have determined that the current PSTAC rate should be increased to recover \$66,123 in additional revenues. The \$66,123 PSTAC increase was calculated based on the following components:
 - a. an under-recovery of actual wastewater treatment charges of approximately \$30,951 for the calendar year ending December 31, 2014 (See Exhibit A, attached hereto, pages 1 to 3);
 - b. projected SCUMA charges for 2016 of \$167,308 based on SCUMA rates effective for 2016 (See Exhibit A, page 5); and

- c. the total costs of this proceeding are deemed to be \$14,848 (See Exhibit A, page 4). These costs will be shared 50/50 between ratepayers and shareholders, resulting in a cost to customers of \$7,424 (See Exhibit A, page 7); and
- d. the pro forma PSTAC revenues at present rates are projected to be \$139,559 (See Exhibit A, page 6).
- 7. As required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7, the Company has included in its filing an estimate of SCUMA costs for calendar year 2016, which estimate has been used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2016.
- 8. Based on the estimated costs for 2016, the under-recovery for 2014, and the costs of this proceeding, the Parties have agreed that Petitioner's current PSTAC rates on file with the Board should be revised pursuant to the rates indicated on Exhibit A. For the average residential customer, the PSTAC rate will increase from \$5.48 per thousand gallons to \$8.08 per thousand gallons, an increase of \$2.60 per thousand gallons or approximately 47.4%. With respect to the total monthly rate for wastewater services, the total monthly rate for the average residential customer using approximately 3,900 gallons per month will increase from \$34.86 to \$44.97, an increase of \$10.11 or approximately 29% monthly.
- 9. Consistent with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq., the Parties agree that the Company will file with the Board a PSTAC petition to reconcile calendar year 2015 actual SCUMA costs with the estimated SCUMA costs (as reflected in the rates identified on Exhibit A) for the same period. Additionally, the Company will include in its filing an estimate of SCUMA costs for calendar year 2017, which estimate will be used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2017, as required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7.

- 10. The Parties have engaged in full discovery. The Parties agree that the within Stipulation reflects a mutual balancing of various issues and positions, and that it is being entered into in the spirit of compromise and to avoid protracted and costly litigation.
- 11. This Stipulation is the product of negotiations by the Parties, and it is an express condition of the settlement embodied by this Stipulation that it be presented to the Board in its entirety without modification or condition. It is also the intent of the Parties to this Stipulation that this settlement, once accepted and approved by the Board, shall govern all issues specified and agreed to herein. The Parties to this Stipulation specifically agree that if adopted in its entirety by the Board, no appeal shall be taken by them from the order adopting same as to those issues upon which the Parties have stipulated herein.
- 12. The Parties agree that each term within this Stipulation reflects a mutual balancing of various issues and positions and is intended to be accepted and approved in its entirety. Each term is vital to this Stipulation as a whole, since the Parties hereto expressly and jointly state that they would not have signed this Stipulation had any terms been modified in any way. In the event any particular aspect of this Stipulation is not accepted and approved by the Board, then any Party hereto materially affected thereby shall not be bound to proceed under this Stipulation.
- 13. The Parties further agree that with respect to any policy or other issues which were compromised in the spirit of reaching an agreement, none of the Parties shall be prohibited from, or prejudiced in, arguing a different policy or position before the Board in any other proceeding, as such agreements pertain only to this matter and to no other matter. It is specifically understood and agreed that this Stipulation represents a negotiated agreement and has been made exclusively for the purpose of this proceeding. Except as expressly provided

herein, the Parties shall not be deemed to have approved, agreed to, or consented to any principle or methodology underlying or supposedly underlying any agreement provided herein in total or by specific item. The Parties further agree that this Stipulation is in no way binding upon them in any other proceeding, except to enforce the terms of this Stipulation.

14. This Stipulation may be executed in as many counterparts as there are Parties to this Stipulation, each of which counterparts shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on or about May 22, 2015, Aqua New Jersey, Inc., Wallkill Sewer Division, formerly the Wallkill Sewer Company (the "Company"), filed a petition with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (the "Board") for approval to increase the current level of its Purchased Wastewater Treatment Adjustment Clause ("PSTAC"). Specifically, the Company is seeking a comprehensive reconciliation of purchased wastewater treatment costs and revenues for the calendar years 2007 to 2014, authorization to adjust the level of its PSTAC based on a net under-recovery of wastewater treatment costs for 2014, as well as to set prospective rates for 2016 to recover additional estimated wastewater treatment costs. Consequently, the Company is proposing to increase its PSTAC charge from \$5.48 per thousand gallons to \$8.46 per thousand gallons, an increase of approximately \$2.98 per thousand gallons or approximately 54% per thousand gallons. The PSTAC charge provides no profit to the Company and is a pass-through of actual charges from the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority.

WASTEWATER BILLS ARE RENDERED BASED ON THE AMOUNT OF WATER USED, AND INCLUDE A FIXED CHARGE OF \$13.52 PER MONTH AND A VOLUMETRIC PSTAC CHARGE. THE COMPANY IS NOT PROPOSING TO CHANGE THE FIXED CHARGE, BUT IS PROPOSING TO INCREASE THE PSTAC CHARGE TO REFLECT THE ACTUAL COSTS BEING INCURRED BY THE COMPANY. IF APPROVED, AN AVERAGE RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMER USING 4,000 GALLONS OF WATER PER MONTH WILL SEE HIS/HER TOTAL MONTHLY BILL FOR WASTEWATER SERVICE INCREASE FROM APPROXIMATELY \$35.44 TO \$47.36, AN INCREASE OF \$11.92 PER MONTH, OR APPROXIMATELY 34%.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that a public hearing on the Company's Petition has been scheduled for September 29, 2015 starting at 5:30 pm at the Crystal Springs Clubhouse at the Grand Cascades Lodge, Silver Spring Room, Three Wild Turkey Way, Hardyston, NJ 07419.
