NOTICE TO PUBLIC SERVICE ELECTRIC AND GAS COMPANY ELECTRIC AND GAS CUSTOMERS
IN THE MATTER OF THE PETITION OF PUBLIC SERVICE ELECTRIC AND GAS COMPANY TO MODIFY ITS MANUFACTURED GAS PLANT (MGP)
REMEDIAL COMPONENT WITHIN ITS ELIZABETH SOCIETAL BENEFITS CHARGE (SBC) AND ITS GAS SBC, DURING THE REMEDIATION
ADJUSTMENT CHARGE (RAC) 23 PERIOD, AUGUST 1, 2016 TO JULY 31, 2017

Notice of Filing and Notice of Public Hearings Docket No. GR16026093

TAKENOTE that, on November 1, 2017, Public Service Electric & Gas Company (Public Service, PSE&G) the Company filed a Petition and supporting documentation with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (Board, BPJU) in Docket Number GR16026093 regarding its increase in 44 Manufactured Gas Plant (MGP) Remediation charges. In its Remediation Adjustment Charge (RAC) component of its Societal Benefits Charge (SBC), pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21 and N.J.S.A. 48:2-21.1. The Company's RAC has been implemented in accordance with prior BPJU Orders which allowed the Company to recover through successive year-year amortizations, reasonable costs incurred in the Company's MGP Program. This Program has been and continues to be carried out under the direction and supervision of the NJDEP. In this filing, the Company seeks an Order finding that its Program costs incurred during the RAC 23 period, August 1, 2016, through July 31, 2017, are reasonable for recovery, and the rates are proposed to be effective on or about May 1, 2018, included in this filing is one-seventh (1/7) of each of RAC 19 through RAC 23 program costs. The Company requests that the Board increase its current gas RAC rates by \$7,896 million and increase the current electric RAC rates by \$1,711 million, for a total increase of \$9,607 million on an annual basis for customers receiving service under tariff rates.

The new proposed RAC charges for electric and gas customers, if approved by the Board, are shown in Table #1. The allocation to gas contract customers has been incorporated on the basis of the terms of the particular contracts and/or applicable Board Orders, rather than on a volumetric basis.

The approximate effect of the proposed increase on typical electric and gas residential monthly bills, if approved by the Board, is illustrated in Tables #2 and #3.

Based on the filing, a typical residential electric customer using 750 kWh/month per summer month and 7,200 kWh/month per year on an annual basis would see an increase in their annual bill from \$1,236.12 to \$1,236.48, or \$0.36, or approximately 0.03%.

A residential gas heating customer using 100 therms per month during the winter months and 610 therms on an annual basis would see an increase in their annual bill from \$555.40 to \$555.16, or \$0.24, or approximately 0.04%. Moreover, under the Company's proposal, a typical residential gas heating customer using 100 therms per month during the winter months and 1,010 therms on an annual basis would see an increase in their annual bill from \$676.15 to \$681.88, or \$5.73, or approximately 0.85%.

The Board has the statutory authority pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21, to establish the RAC charges to levels it finds just and reasonable. Therefore, the Board may establish the RAC charges at a level other than that proposed by Public Service. Therefore, the described charges may increase or decrease based upon the Board's decision.
