We are writing in response to the above-referenced petition, which Atlantic City Electric Company (“ACE” or “the Company”) filed with the Secretary of the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (“Board”) on September 25, 2020 and supplemented on October 9, 2020.

Board Staff has reviewed the petition for completeness, in accordance with the Board’s June 10, 2020 Order in Docket Nos. QO19010040, QO19060648, and QO17091004 (“June 2020 Order”). Staff has determined that the petition is not administratively complete. We have enclosed, for your information, a list of the deficiencies in the petition and the information/documentation required to remedy the deficiencies.

N.J.S.A. 48:3-98.1(b) provides the Board with 180 days to approve, modify, or deny ACE’s requested recovery of costs for the above-referenced program. As stated in the Board’s May 2008 Order in Docket No. EO08030164, the 180-day review period will commence on the last filing date of the remediation of all deficiencies.

I. General Filing Requirements

c. States the following:

The utility shall provide supporting explanations, assumptions, calculations, and work papers for each proposed program and cost recovery mechanism petition filed under N.J.S.A. 48:3-98.1, including the rationale for selecting the approach included in its proposed program(s), and for all qualitative and quantitative analyses therein. The utility shall provide electronic copies of all materials and supporting schedules, with all inputs and formulae intact.

This Minimum Filing Requirement (“MFR”) requires the petitioner to submit electronic copies of all materials and supporting schedules, with all inputs and formulae intact. This information was not provided.

II. Cost Recovery Mechanism

b. States the following:

The utility shall provide detailed spreadsheets of the accounting treatment of the proposed cost recovery, including describing how costs will be amortized, which accounts will be debited or credited each month, and how the costs will flow through the proposed program cost recovery method.

This MFR requires the petitioner submit detailed spreadsheets. To date, ACE has not submitted all electronic files with formulae intact.
