Dear BPU:

As a NJ based employer of solar installation teams we want to express our concerns about the proposed successor program to the NJ Clean Energy Solar Program:

1. By reducing the value of the incentives from the \$152.00 down to possibly \$85.00 or less will have a severe impact on the viability of many projects in NJ and will cause layoffs and job losses. The incentives should stay the same and not go down to continue the level of employment in solar in NJ.
2. By limiting the size of the market of what can be built each year in each for solar will cause job losses in the industry. No limits should be place on the size of the market in NJ to not cause job lose..
3. The BPU should work with the Legislature and Governor Murphy's office to increase the societal benefit fund fee on electric bills to be able to fund more community solar projects and provide lower cost green energy to low and middle income families. By reducing the incentives new community solar projects will not be able to be funded.
4. By reducing the incentives the Governors goal of 100% green energy will be unobtainable in the timeframes proposed by the Governor.
