The Alliance for Action strongly supports PSEG's application for extension of Zero Emission Certificates for several reasons.

- Nearly 4 million New Jersey homes and businesses rely on PSEG's nuclear facilities for 'round the clock power. The
 plants are key to providing safe, reliable and affordable power.
- PSEG's nuclear facilities provide 90% of our state's carbon-free electric. They're critically important to New Jersey's environment and the state's clean energy goals.
- PSEG's nuclear facilities provide thousands of jobs throughout New Jersey. Protecting the plants' future is vital to the state's economy.
- Nuclear power is imperative in protecting New Jersey's energy diversity.

Nationwide nuclear plants are financially struggling to survive. In fact, three eastern United States nuclear facilities have been forced to shut down in recent years. PSEG's plants now face the same dire economic problems. The Zero Emission Certificate extension would provide funding to keep the plants open and to protect New Jersey's largest source of carbon free energy, our economy, our energy diversity and our energy reliability.
