B. Since receiving approval from the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("NJ BPU") to offer its suite of Electric Vehicle ("EV") programs to New Jersey rate payers, Atlantic City Electric ("ACE") has made significant efforts to establish internal program implementation processes in support of an official EV program launch target of mid Q4 2021. Beginning in April 2021, ACE began coordination with its customer and smart grid program implementation teams to develop a request for proposals ("RFP") to solicit bids from 3rd party program implementation contractors who would be responsible for ongoing data gathering and reporting activities for the duration of the program. ACE finalized the development of its RFP in June 2021 and began accepting bids from implementation contractors in July 2021. ACE is currently reviewing the proposals received as part of the RFP process, and expects to select an implementation contractor to support program implementation in September 2021.

Once the implementation contractor is selected, ACE will confirm and finalize all data aggregation requirements to ensure alignment with program design requirements as agreed upon in its stipulation of settlement.

In parallel with the development of the RFP process for selection of a program implementation contractor, ACE has worked to develop a process to track customer interests in its forthcoming EV programs. Through the establishment of both an EV program dedicated <u>website</u> and email inbox, ACE has been able to catalog current customer interests in its transitional Demand Charge Solution rate offering (launched for qualifying existing DCFC customers in April 2021) as well as its soon to be launched Make Ready offerings. Leveraging this pipeline of customer interest in the program will allow support expedited deployment of program funds after official program launch.

NOTE: This semi-annual report covers the first half (H1) of 2021 (H1 2021), for the period of January 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021. Where applicable, forecasted and actual units of work and/or major tasks completed are provided.
