### **REQUEST TO EXTEND THE TIME TO APPLY TO INTERVENE**


Dear President Fiordaliso:

On June 29, 2022, the Board of Public Utilities entered in Order in this matter, made effective Friday, July 1, 2022. The Order contains a provision that any party seeking to intervene in the matter must do so on or before July 15, 2022. The City of North Wildwood has a significant interest in considering intervention in this matter. However, the timeframe of the Order makes it exceedingly difficult for North Wildwood to submit a Motion to Intervene on or before July 15, 2022. The issue will have to be considered by the governing body of North Wildwood, and the governing body will not have enough time to place the matter on an upcoming meeting agenda and have papers prepared for filing on or before July 15, 2022.

Accordingly, on behalf of the City of North Wildwood, I am requesting that the Board of Public Utilities amend the aforementioned order to make the deadline for filing a Motion to Intervene, on or before July 31, 2022. This will not cause any significant delay in the matter and will provide this and other potential intervenors an orderly, thoughtful and reasonable process and timeframe.

We are hopeful of your consideration of what North Wildwood believes to be a reasonable and workable approach. Thank you.
