Docket No. EO22020080 PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that in 2018, Governor Phil Murphy signed Executive Order No. 28, which directed the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board or "NJBPU") to develop an Energy Master Plan ("EMP") to serve as the State's blueprint to achieve 100% clean energy by 2050.2 Released on January 27, 2020, the 2019 EMP establishes a set of goals to put New Jersey on a pathway to achieve the State's clean energy goals, and expands upon previous EMPs to account for the complete energy system in the State, including electricity generation, transportation, and usage in commercial buildings. Additionally, the 2019 EMP incorporates mandates from the Clean Energy Act of 2018, 3 the Zero Emission Vehicle Memorandum of Understanding,4 and the Global Warming Response Act of 20095 to reduce GHG emissions 80% by 2050, relative to 2006 levels. um of 5 to reduce

This year, the EMP will undergo an update as required by the EMP Statute ("Statute").6 The 2022 EMP Update ("Update") will address the following seven strategies enumerated in the 2019 EMP ("Strategies"), as well as provide an overview of the State's progress toward achieving 100% clean energy, and an 80% reduction in greenhouse gas ("GHG") emissions, by 2050:

- Reducing Energy Consumption and Emissions from the Transportation Sector;
 Accelerating Deployment of Renewable Energy and Distributed Energy Resources;
 Maximizing Energy Efficiency and Conservation, and Reducing Peak Demand;
- Peak Demand; ²⁵ 4. Reducing Energy Consumption and Emissions from the Building Sector; 5. Decarbonizing and Modernizing New Jersey's Energy System; 6. Supporting Community Energy Planning and Action in Underserved Communities; and 7. Expanding the Clean Energy Innovation Economy.⁷

The Update will incorporate progress information acquired through interagency collaboration and stakeholder feedback to make recommendations on how to continue steering New Jersey toward its overall clean energy and climate goals.
