# 2022 Vegetation Management Semi-Annual Spending Report Introduction

In accordance with the Stipulation of Settlement executed and adopted in connection with BPU Docket No. ER20120746, Atlantic City Electric Company ("ACE" or the "Company") submits its 2022 Semi-Annual Spend Report for Vegetation Management. This report covers the period from July 1, 2022 through (and including) December 31, 2022. The Company has experienced increases in the cost of its vegetation management program in recent years due to several factors. To better understand the reasons for these cost increases, ACE agreed to provide the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (the "Board" or "BPU") and the New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel with a semi-annual report on the cost components incurred in the Company's vegetation management program in the prior six-month period, through the period ending December 31, 2024. The Company will also provide (1) the total miles trimmed (planned versus actual); (2) tree removals conducted (planned versus actual); and explanations for any cost increases or budget overruns exceeding 10 percent.

# Vegetation Management Budget Forecast and 2022 Spend

The ACE Distribution Vegetation Management plan first focuses on vegetation areas that have historically caused issues in the Company's reliability performance; the schedule is front loaded to work on the feeders that have had poor vegetation reliability. Other feeders are then inspected by an independent planning contractor trained in utility arboriculture and tree risk assessment to develop a work plan for each feeder. When preparing future work, the team factors in such constraints as: the influx of people to resort areas during the summer seasons, easement rights, police flagging requirements, and contractor availability. Once vegetation work is completed by ACE's contractors, it is then inspected for adherence and work quality by the Company to ensure all work is in alignment with the annual plan.

**Table 1** indicates the Vegetation Management actual spend from January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 measured against the 2022 budget over the same period. Spending variances are also provided.

#### **Variance Explanation:**

Vegetation Management underspent the 2022 budget due to a lower volume of work being required in order to meet all applicable BPU regulations and standards.

**Table 2** indicates the Vegetation Management actual spend from July 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 measured against the 2022 budget over the same period. Spending variances are also provided.

#### **Variance Explanation:**

Vegetation Management was below budget for the second half of the year, with spending 30 percent lower than budget due to a lower volume of work being identified to meet all applicable BPU regulations and standards.

# Total Mileage Trimmed

From July 2022 through December 2022, the Company completed 753 miles out of a targeted 850 miles. From January 1, 2022 through December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022, 1,819 miles were trimmed out of a targeted 1,819 miles.

#### **Variance Explanation:**

Vegetation Management completed fewer miles than anticipated during the second half of the year, but the target total miles trimmed for 2022 were met and the target goal was completed.

## Tree Removals

From July 2022 through December 2022, the Company completed 1,455 removals out of 1,455 removals.

#### **Variance Explanation:**

Vegetation Management completed all scheduled tree removals during the second half of the year.
