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1	PRESIDENT FIORDALISO: Mr. Rossi?			
2	Obviously has something to do with money, if you're			
3	here.			
4	MR. ROSSI: Good morning, Mr.			
5	President			
6	PRESIDENT FIORDALISO: Good			
7	morning.			
8	MR. ROSSI: and Commissioners.			
9	In the matter of the Comprehensive Energy Efficiency			
10	and Renewable Energy Resource Analysis for Fiscal			
11	Year 2024 Clean Energy Program, staff is pleased to			
12	present recommendations on funding levels. As the			
13	Commissioners are aware, the Electric Discount and			
14	Energy Competition Act required the Board to			
15	initially undertake a comprehensive resource			
16	analysis, or CRA, every four years. Since 2012 this			
17	has been done on an annual basis and for FY24 Staff			
18	has drafted another one year CRA.			
19	The CRA straw proposal includes the			
20	level of funding estimated to meet the needs of the			
21	New Jersey Clean Energy Program. For FY24, Staff is			
22	recommending that the Board set an SBC funding level			
23	of \$344,665,000.00, which is the same founding level			
24	approved by the Board since FY15.			
25	A virtual public hearing and			

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1	recording regarding this CRA, along with these
2	programs and budgets and compliance filings, were
3	held via webinar on June 2 and comments were
4	accepted through June 12. On May 12, via the BPU
5	list serve and NJ CEP website the Board approved a
6	notice of a June 2, 2023 virtual public hearing and
7	on May 22 staff released the straw proposal and
8	other FY24 program and budget documents.
9	The CRA straw proposal recommends
10	that the \$344,665,000.00 in new SBC funding be
11	approved for FY24. Staff is recommending that this
12	be allocated across the energy efficiency programs,
13	distributed energy resource programs, renewable
14	energy programs, EDA programs, planning and
15	administration, BPU initiatives, and State energy
16	initiatives. When combined with the new funding and
17	other sources of funds, which include prior
18	estimated commitments carried over from FY23, the
19	total new proposed FY24 funding level is
20	\$660,108,841.00. Staff estimates that the proposed
21	FY24 funding level will be sufficient to maintain a
22	full portfolio of programs.
23	Staff has also determined that by
24	maintaining the FY23 SBC funding level in FY24 that
25	there will be no incremental impacts on rates. The

1	CRA straw proposal sets out in details the rational				
2	utilized by Staff in developing the FY24 funding				
3	level.				
4	Having reviewed and considered the				
5	comments regarding the FY24 funding level, Staff				
6	recommends that the Board set, adopt, and approve				
7	the proposed FY24 funding level and proposed FY24				
8	utility payments.				
9	COMMISSIONER HOLDEN: So moved.
