It is our shared hope that you take to heart all recommendations you receive that are centered on proven renewable energy alternatives and plans that ethically meet New Jersey's energy needs.

- Waterspirit recommends that NJBPU ensure any/all stakeholder engagement processes are intentionally inclusive across languages, geographic locations and media channels
- Waterspirit recommends that NJBPU place an immediate moratorium on spending toward new and expanded oil and gas projects
- Waterspirit recommends that NJBPU conduct widespread solar siting across the state and related assessments for distributed energy storage potential
- Waterspirit recommends that the NJBPU consider the potential future for young people across income levels when making impactful or long term economic decisions
- Waterspirit recommends that the NJBPU consider the disastrous, dangerous, and costly health impacts
  of gas power on ratepayers who live in and around toxic, polluting infrastructure
- Waterspirit recommends that NJBPU read the recent study that came out of Pennsylvania linking hydraulic fracturing infrastructure proximity to detrimental health of children, animals and water
- Waterspirit recommends that NJBPU take into account independent studies debunking so-called RNG and not succumb to biased information from industry supporters
