# 2023 Reliability Improvement Plan Semi-Annual Spending Report Introduction

In accordance with Paragraph 20 on page 7 of the Decision and Order Adopting Initial Decision and Stipulation of Settlement executed and adopted in connection with BPU Docket No. ER2010746, Atlantic City Electric Company ("ACE" or the "Company") submits its 2023 Semi-Annual Spend Report for Vegetation Management ("VM"). This report covers the period from July 1, 2023 through (and including) December 31, 2023. The Company has experienced increases in the cost of its Vegetation Management program in recent years due to several factors. To better understand the reasons for these cost increases, ACE agreed to provide the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities and the New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel with a semi-annual report on the cost components incurred in its vegetation management program in the prior six-month period, through the period ending December 31, 2024. The Company will also provide (1) the total miles trimmed (planned versus actual), (2) tree removals conducted (planned versus actual), and (3) explanations for any cost increases or budget overruns exceeding 10 percent.

# Vegetation Management Budget Forecast and 2023 Spend

The ACE Distribution Vegetation Management plan first focuses on vegetation areas that have historically caused issues in the Company's reliability performance. The schedule is front loaded to work on the feeders that have had poor vegetation reliability. Other feeders are then inspected by an independent planning contractor trained in utility arboriculture and tree risk assessment to develop a work plan for each feeder. When preparing future work, the team factors in such constraints as: the influx of people to resort areas during the summer seasons, easement rights, police flagging requirements, and contractor availability. Once vegetation work is completed by ACE's contractors, it is then inspected for adherence and work quality by the Company to ensure all work is in alignment with the annual plan. 

 Table 1 indicates the Vegetation Management actual spend from July 1, 2023 through

 December 31, 2023, measured against the 2023 budget over the same period. Spending variances

 are also provided:

### Variance Explanation:

ACE Vegetation Management spent more money than originally budgeted during the first half of 2023 performing scheduled maintenance. Consequently, it spent less than originally budgeted in the second half of the year. Additionally, ACE experienced significant storm activity during the third and fourth quarter of 2023, which impeded VM spending. For the entire year of 2023, ACE VM spending was approximately 10 percent under budget.

# Total Mileage Trimmed

From July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, the Company completed 759 miles out of a targeted 887 miles.

### Variance Explanation:

ACE completed more targeted miles in the first half of 2023, leading to fewer completed miles in the second half of the year. For the entire year of 2023, ACE completed trimming on 1,896 miles, which equaled the target miles for the year.

### Tree Removals

From July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, the Company completed 1,055 removals out of a targeted 1,055 removals.

**Variance Explanation**: The Company met its targeted number of tree removals for the second half of the year. ACE completed 1,543 tree removals during 2023, which met the target.
