Notice of Reallocation of Sub-Program Budgets

Dear Secretary Golden:

The undersigned is Assistant General Counsel to Atlantic City Electric Company ("ACE" or the "Company") in the above referenced matter(s).

On June 10, 2020, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (the "Board" or "BPU") issued an Order directing each electric and gas public utility in the State of New Jersey to establish energy efficiency and peak demand reduction programs pursuant to the Clean Energy Act of 2018.¹ A portfolio of ACE Energy Efficiency programs was approved by the Board on April 27, 2021.²

The Company is providing this communication in accordance with the notification requirements for shifting sub-program budgets within sectors, as permitted by the June 2020 EE Order and the April 2021 ACE EE Order. Specifically, ACE is permitted to shift up to 25 percent of an individual sub-program's total budget within the Residential and/or the Commercial and Industrial ("C&I") sectors by providing notice to Staff of the Board.³

Residential Program Changes. Within the Residential Portfolio, ACE is notifying Staff of the movement of \$850,000 that will be transferred from the Home Weatherization/Moderate Income Weatherization program. It is anticipated that \$649,958.90 will be transferred to the Residential HVAC Rebate Program. Additionally, \$200,041.10 will be transferred to the Appliance Rebates Program to cover Marketplace. This shift is due to increased savings production from gas partners and the increased cost of implementing the HVAC program, which has largely been driven by consumer interest in the zero percent interest financing program after significant increases in market interest rates. These reallocations of funds will ensure uninterrupted implementation through the end of Program Year 3 and are below the 25 percent threshold referenced above.
