Dear Commissioner LaTourette, Assistant Commissioner Angarone, Ms. Stewart, Ms. Davis, Green Acres Program Team, BPU Secretary Golden, Atlantic City Clerk Geletei and Ms. Daniels:

I am writing on behalf of Defend Our Beaches NJ aka Defend Brigantine Beach, Inc. We are a volunteer citizen's action group and stakeholders in the above mentioned matter.

Please take notice that the Atlantic Shores Project's Public Notice (the "Notice") is defective because the Lots and Blocks in the Notice were not consistent with their final Green Acres Diversion Application. You are required to re-notice the Project with the proper Blocks and Lots for appropriate public comment, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:36 et seq.

For these reasons, among many, the Green Acres diversion request should be rejected and the Permit should be terminated.

Documentation of the lack of proper notice, inconsistency between the Notice as made, the Application and final Permit is described in the attached.
